
HIV Care Coordination

The Mission Statement

HIV Care Coordination is a specialized form of case management. Its mission is to coordinate a wide variety of health and social services to assist those living with HIV/AIDS.

The Program

Aspire Indiana Care Coordinators provide case management services and identify clients' needs while developing a goal-oriented care plan to meet the needs of those living with HIV/AIDS.



The program consists of goal-oriented activities that serve to locate, facilitate access to, and monitor the full range of HIV-related services in cooperation with the client. It encourages the most cost effective use of medical and community resources and promotes the overall well-being of the individual.

It respects cultural diversity, emphasizes confidentiality, and strives to ensure the clients' freedom of choice and self-determination. Its comprehensive and compassionate services are rendered in a safe, secure, and non-judgmental environment. These services are provided at no cost to the client.

Eligibility

- Care Coordination is free of charge to individuals living with HIV/AIDS.

- Individuals may be referred to the program by health care professionals, case workers, family members, friends or by self referral.

Medical Services Program

- Care Coordination staff assists clients with the application process which helps lessen the cost of medical care.

Referrals to Community Resources

- Care Coordinators help clients achieve goals by accessing and using available community resources.

HOPWA

- Provides rent, mortgage, and utility assistance.

Community Outreach & Education

Special Populations Support Program

The Mission Statement

To prevent the spread of HIV and to provide services with integrity and confidentiality through education, advocacy and comprehensive health and social services to those infected with HIV and who are experiencing life difficulties because of substance use.

The Program

The Special Populations Support Program (SPSP) strives to minimize the negative impact of substance use on the health of persons living with HIV/AIDS.

The program consists of HIV testing, referral services, outreach, education and counseling for persons with a substance use history, and referral services for those dually diagnosed with HIV and a substance related disorder.

Services Provided

Testing

- Specialists provide free behavioral risk assessments, free confidential HIV/Hepatitis/Syphilis tests and referrals for services for those identified as being HIV positive.

Supportive Care Specialists

- Specialists engage the consumer with interventions designed to minimize substance use and maximize compliance with all applicable treatment plans. The specialists work closely with the local HIV Care Coordination provider to ensure that the consumer receives a full compliment of care.

Community Outreach & Education

SPSP Case Managers are available to provide outreach, education and testing in the service regions listed on the back panel of this brochure.
